Let's work together: MISSIONS TO SEAFARERS

About the Mission Loneliness, danger and separation from loved ones are just some of the challenges that seafarers face every day. SEAFARING IS ONE OF THE WORLD'S MOST DANGEROUS OCCUPATIONS. Over 90% of world trade is carried by sea, providing work to 1.5 million seafarers. For many years St. John's have been filling Mission to Seafarers boxes but find it more difficult to do each year. This year – it has been suggested that this project be a joint effort by the Parish of Ship Harbour and Musquodoboit. Rather than one ACW group or individual collecting for the Mission to Sea Farers Christmas Boxes, could all ACW groups participate starting now, so that by the time Christmas arrives we will have many Christmas shoe boxes filled, containing hats, scarves, gloves writing paper, socks or personal items i.e. Toilet supplies soap, deodorant, shampoo, shaving cream, razors, tooth brush, tooth paste, playing cards, pens, postcards, Etc. Items may be given to Eleanor, Christine or Eileen any time. Boxes are sent in, in December but we welcome items any time. There will be more information to follow. Thanks everyone
